Chords of Three

These I, IV, and V chords are triads. *Triad* means "three." Each triad has three pitches. Triads usually start with the root, or the lowest pitch of the chord. Therefore, when the root is on the line, the triad is built on the next two lines above. When the root is in a space, the triad is built on the next two spaces above.
